

The SeaPac 94 Seminar Program features 34 outstanding presentations by persons who are experts in their field, on topics which are both interesting and important to the amateur community. We believe you'll find them worth your while.

The program includes seminars in five topic tracks. Eight are dedicated to Beginners, 5 to Emergency Preparedness, 7 to Digital communications (mainly packet), 8 to Technical subjects not in one of the other tracks, and 4 to Organizational/General Interest subjects. One seminar in the Beginners track, one in Digital Communications, and one in the Technical Track are repeated Sunday morning.

New this year is a workshop on Friday from 12:00 noon to 6:00PM, given by Jon Bloom, KE3Z, Senior Technical Dept. Engineer at ARRL HQ. This workshop on Digital Signal Processing is designed for amateurs interested in studying this exciting new technique in more depth.






