Rick Roderick, K5UR, ARRL President lives north of Little Rock, Arkansas on a 50 acre hilltop QTH. He has worked 370 countries, including 314 countries on 160 meters, 351 countries on 80 meters, 353 countries on 40 meters, and 152 countries on 6 meters. He holds DXCC on 10 bands and is ranked 5th in the world on the DXCC Challenge Award. He holds over 20 different Worked All Zones Awards, and was one of the first to achieve Worked All Zones on 160 meters.

He's been a ham for over 40 years. Life Member of the ARRL and has held numerous ARRL volunteer positions continuously for all of those 44 plus years. He served on the ARRL DX Advisory Committee and was chairman for many years. He has also served on CQ Magazine's DX Advisory Committee for 40 years. He was instrumental in the creation and implementation of Logbook of the World, and the DXCC Challenge Award. He has been on the ARRL Board of Directors for 20 years and formerly served as ARRL First Vice President. He loves ham radio!!!!!

Howard is a retired US Air Force officer, having served as a pilot, satellite launch director, engineer, and engineering manager. He notes that during his time in the military, wherever he could set up an antenna, he took the opportunity to operate.

He notes that he has always had a strong interest in building and repairing radio equipment. "I've operated CW/AM/FM/SSB/digital on 80/40/20/15/10/2 on equipment that I have either built, repaired, or modified. Michel says that some of his favorite activities include attending hamfests to find old stuff to repair or repurpose, contest operating, and DXing, especially on 80/40 meters. He adds that he is a Life Member of the Southeastern Massachusetts Amateur Radio Association.

Bob Inderbitzen NQ1R is the manager for marketing at ARRL. He and his staff are responsible for ARRL membership and publication marketing. Bob collaborates with other staff, contributing to benefits, services and products enjoyed by all ARRL members. In 2014, he served as the convention manager for the national ARRL Centennial Convention held in Hartford, Connecticut. Bob regularly attends ARRL's national conventions and Dayton Hamvention as part of the team that organizes and operates ARRL exhibits. He also coordinates ARRL's representation at Europe's largest, annual-held Amateur Radio exhibition in Friedrichshafen, Germany. He enjoys speaking with members and volunteers about ARRL membership recruitment, benefits and services.

Bob obtained his first ham radio license, KA2PZD (Novice-class) in 1981. He attributes his early interest in Amateur Radio to a fascination with electronics and a patient middle school vice principal who decided to conduct an Amateur Radio class. Bob says, "I was the only student who enjoyed being sent to the vice principal's office. That's where the radio was!" Bob earned the call sign NQ1R when he upgraded to Amateur Extra class in 1989.

Jeri Ellsworth AI6TK



Jeri Janet Ellsworth was born in Georgia and grew up in the cities of Dallas, Oregon and Yamhill, Oregon, where she was raised by her father, owner of a Mobil gas station. As a child, she persuaded her father to let her use a Commodore 64 computer that had originally been bought for her brother. She learned to program for herself by reading C64 manuals. While attending high school, she drove Dirt Track rac-

ing cars with her father, and began designing new models in her shop, eventually selling her own customized race cars. This allowed her to abandon her studies to continue with the business.

She is a self-taught entrepreneur and designer of integrated circuits and American inventor. It was unveiled in 2004, when she created a complete Commodore 64 system on a chip located inside a joystick, which she called "C64 Direct-to-TV". In 1995, when she was 21 years old, she decided that she wanted to get away from the racing car business, and together with a friend she started a business of assembling and selling computers based on the Intel 486 microprocessor. This new business became a chain of 4 stores, called "Computers Made Easy"

In 2016 she became a licensed amateur radio operator and holds an Extra Class license..

"Power and Communication When Everything Goes Dark"

When all else fails, how are you going to communicate? This workshop will cover how to keep your radio station on the air in an emergency. Topics include:

- What you need to know about batteries, solar panels, charge controllers and inline meters, wiring, distribution blocks, system sizing, and portable antennas.
- How to take your high power station backpack portable.
- How to set up an emergency station using solar power with example setups.
- Will also touch on how to send peer to peer messages via Winlink when regular RMS stations are down or over-whelmed with traffic.
- Will provide information on water, sanitation, providing light and being portable overnight during an emergency.


C.A.R.S. Country Store
