- 2 Span of control, control 3 to 7 people
- **3** Organization Chart
 - Reporting system

COMMUNICATORS, AND/OR OTHER TASK

- Ham vs commercial
- 2 Language, phonetic alphabet and plain language
- 3 Agency systems, radios, faxes, etc
- 4 Memos, ICS-213, agency forms, logs
 - HIPAA, personal, privileged information
 - Know who is who. Who has authority to pass message

- **3** Volunteer protection, Good Samaritan Law
 - A Can't be sued for helping victim

- **1** Personal Protection Equipment
- 2 Radio and special equipment
- 3 Medicine, glasses, food
 - Go Kit, 8-24 hours, 1-3 days, 1-3 weeks
