Kerry Christensen MASTER YODELER



Kerry Christensen

Our banquet program will be a unique musical presentation by Kerry Christensen, Master Yodeler. Kerry is not your everyday yodeler. While good old Western and Alpine yodeling can be very entertaining, Kerry has taken his particular talent far beyond what we might expect to hear. Have you heard songs like the William Tell Overture or Stars and Stripes in yodel form? Along with abundant yodeling talent, Kerry has mastered the alpenhorn, zither, cowbells and what he calls the "Lip Trumpet". Imagine Harry James with no instrument other than a pair of lips.

Kerry was raised on a potato farm in Idaho. After discovering yodeling while on a trip to Austria in 1976, he brought the music back and practiced 14 hours a day while driving tractor on his family's potato farm. He drove his father crazy and was banished to the garage, but that didn't stop his practicing.

His first yodeling performance was at Brigham Young University in 1977, where he brought 15,000 students to their feet for a standing ovation. His career soared when Disney made him the Disney World Yodeler in the German Pavilion of the Epcot Center in 1984-1990. Since that time Kerry has traveled to many countries to perform, including aboard Caribbean cruise ships and festivals throughout the US.

This is an opportunity to hear a world-class musician with an unusual and delightful specialty. Kerry estimates there are only two other full time yodeling soloists in the US and fewer than ten European yodelers who specialize in the dazzling "bravour" style of yodeling. We are sure you will enjoy Kerry's entertainment.

Greg was first licensed in 1955. In the mid-60s, he operated W7AGQ/4 from Virginia and was a staff attorney with the Broadcast Bureau of the FCC in Washington, DC. He returned to 7-land in 1967. Greg became a Judge in 1969 and recently retired as Circuit Court Judge for Washington County, Oregon.

Greg is ARRL Northwest Division Director, a member of QCWA, DXCC, FARS, Willamette Valley DX Club and OTVARC (past President and Trustee).

Sarah has maintained a 4.0 GPA throughout high school. One of her favorite classes this year is AP Physics, and she is also taking a computer networking class. Sarah has been president of a community service club at her school for two years, as well as captain of the cross country team and vice-president of National Honor Society.

Sarah plans to attend Brigham Young University in the fall, where she will continue her involvement in Ham Radio. Sarah will major in Electrical Engineering with a minor in mathematics.

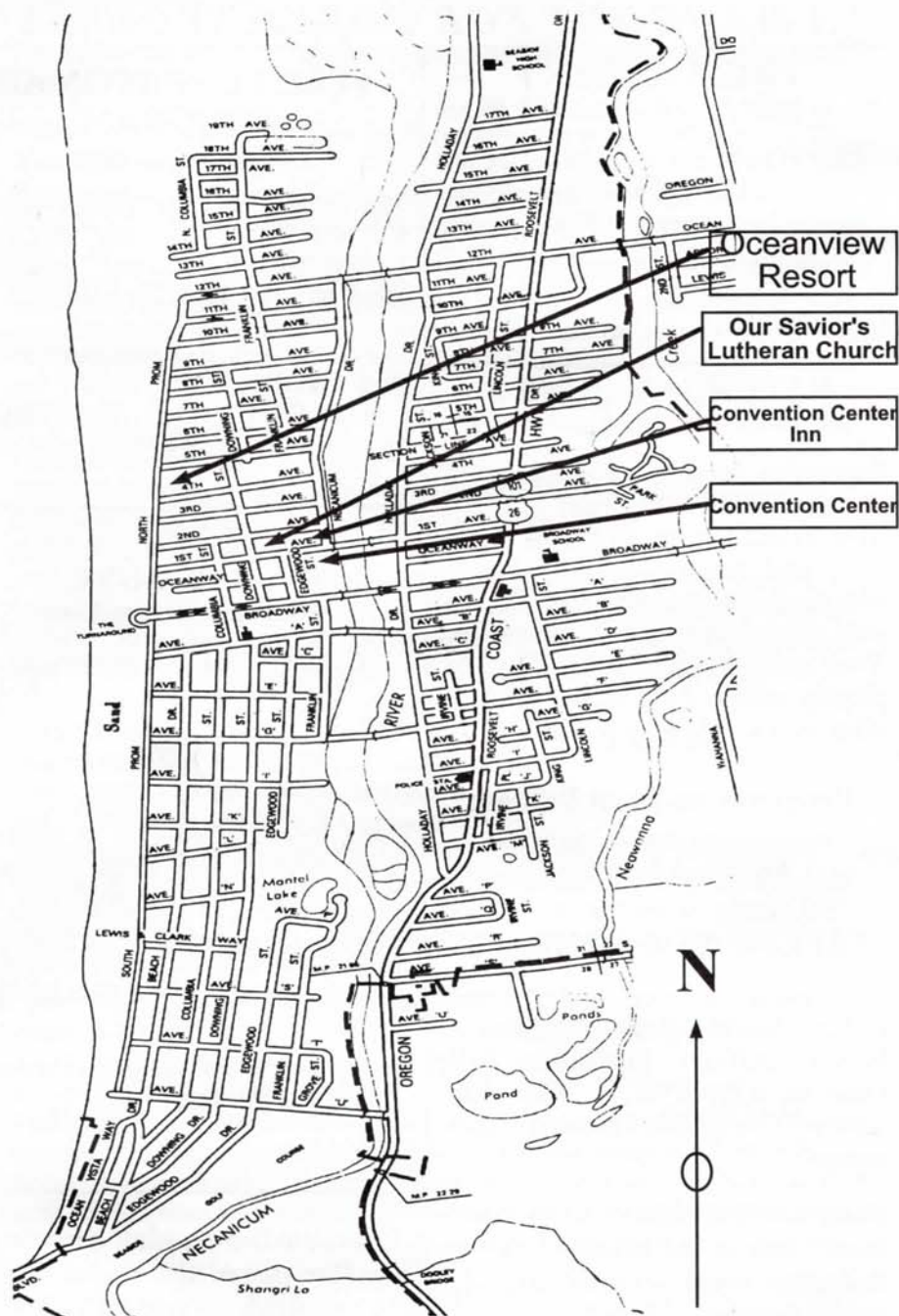

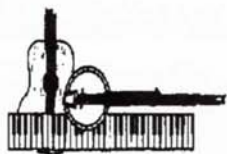

Sea-Pac Pin Design Contest.

The Sea-Pac board has decided to continue the pin design contest for the 2002 Sea-Pac pin. The person with the winning design will receive two tickets to the 2002 Sea-Pac banquet and have their name announced as the designer at the banquet.

The pin designs must be submitted to the board for consideration no later than March 15, 2001. Send designs to Sea-Pac, Post Office Box 219142, Portland, OR 97221. The decision of the board will be final. Furthermore, the manufacturer may make alterations to the design as needed to meet their specifications.

The pin must include the words Sea-Pac, the logo, and the year. The pin size is usually 3/4-inch maximum dimension. It is suggested that designers prepare artwork at 400% minimum. Every area needs to be marked with a color on a sample printout. Remember that color must be surrounded by metal. Tiny or busy areas should be simplified or enlarged. Use strong lines and simple art. Letters are usually in metal, as they are too thin to hold color or too small. Remember the lapel pins are SMALL. Look at the design and visualize putting metal around color and realize that someone has to put color in recesses — if it is too small, they can't do it.

Check out this years pin at the Reception Desk. For more ideas, also buy the previous years, at a reduced cost, and you'll have a sample of what has already been done. You'll also then have a complete collection.
