The EYEWARN Project

- This is a collaborative effort started in 2015 between the Emergency Coordinator(EC) of Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) and the Emergency Manager (EM) of the Clark Regional Emergency Service Agency (CRESA).
- The objective was to engage the body of Ham radio operators throughout the county who are unaffiliated to an organized EMCOMM activity.
- This NET would provide Situation Reports (SITREPs) to CRESA expanding their ground truth situational awareness of damages and injuries in the county.





Background

- There are about 2000 amateur radio operators in Clark County Washington.
- Around 100 belong to the local Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) group.
- In a disaster, that would potentially leave around 1900 Radio operators available to provide visual situational reporting in areas where damages or injuries have occurred.





Who we are and What we do

- EYEWARN consist of dedicated Net Control Stations who gather disaster information from Ham radio operators that choose to report damages or injuries.
- We "Report what we see from where we are"
- We self activate
- We do not deploy





2016 Activities and Events

- CASCADIA RISING (CR-16)
 - Operated five (5) nets providing SITREPS over a two day period to the local EOC.
- Created an EYEWARN promotional Video
